4. We believe people with mental health problems can recover and/or improve their quality of life.

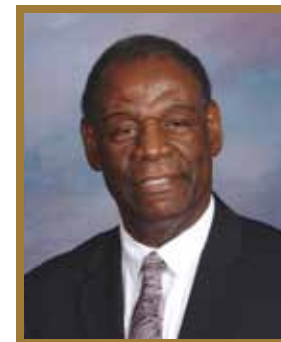

Not long after outpatient programs were implemented, people with mental health issues began moving back into their own communities and participating in normal activities. As a result, their quality of life was enhanced and the community became stronger with increased participation from its citizens. The war continues to be waged for millions of Americans that are stigmatized because of mental health issues.



At Hamilton Center, we are recharging the efforts toward a more accepting society that will find it normal that mental health issues are prevalent within in our communities. We are looking to the future of integrated care that provides services of traditional medical treatment combined with mental health treatment models. 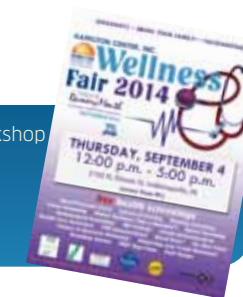

This program means everything to me because there's nothing like being somewhere where you are welcomed. Based on decisions made in life, windows are closed and sometimes not reopened. Hamilton Center has opened doors not just within the corporation, but within the community for me. Having a felony and trying to get a decent paying job is extremely challenging. This program has given me opportunities to learn new skills, and I have been truly blessed by the people who take the time to mentor me." Tatu Brown

 The Shadow.



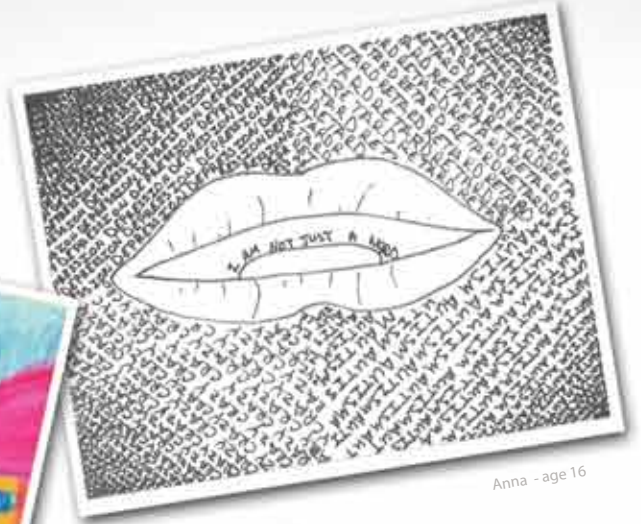

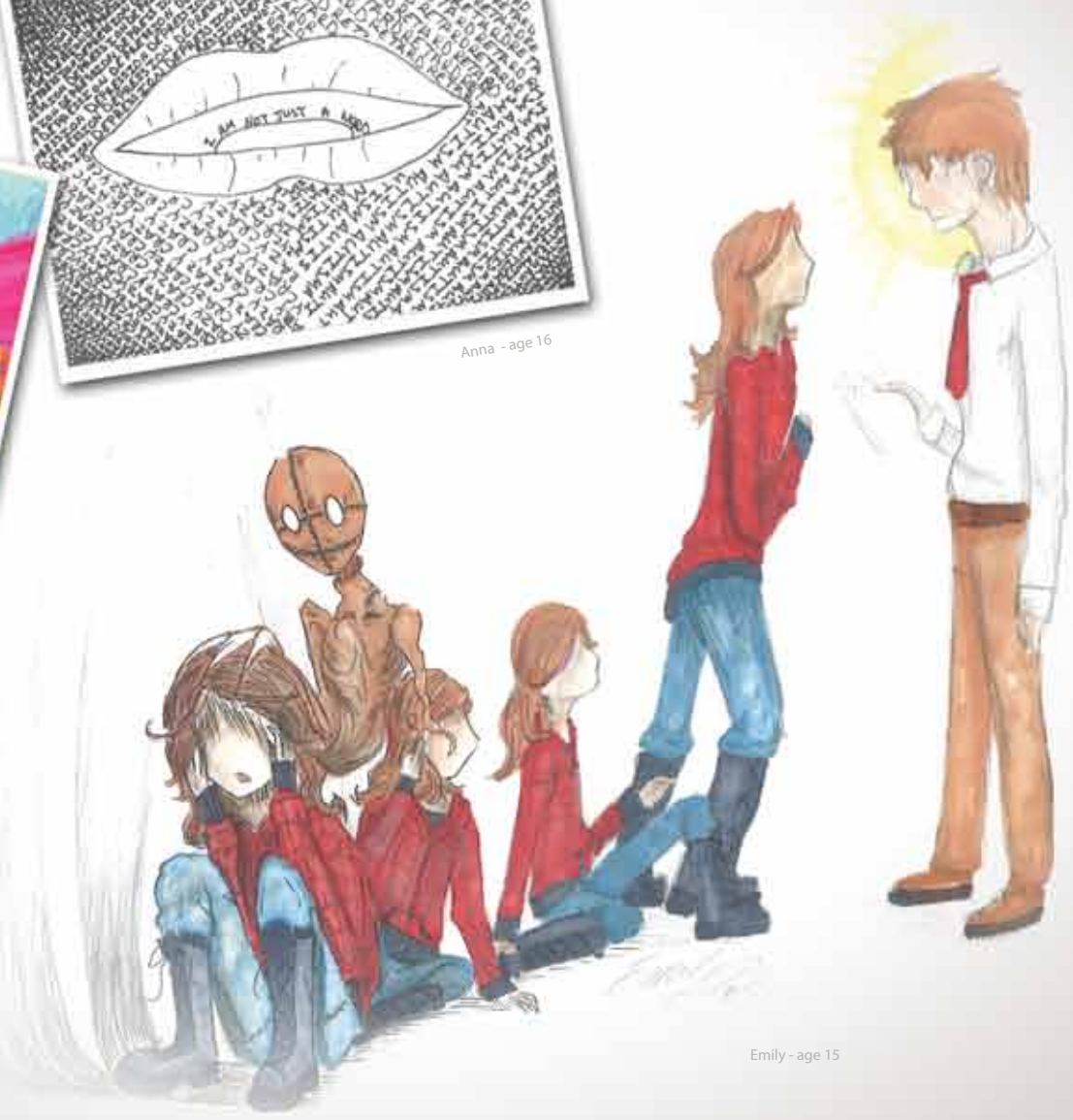

Out of the Shadows

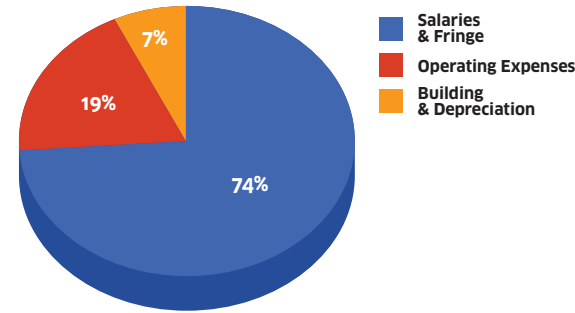
