Child Services

Hamilton Center is committed to the growth and development of healthy children and families, and views parents as a child's first and most important teacher. By utilizing the most up-to-date evidence-based practices our providers identify and treat behavioral health problems to help children increase functioning across all settings, including school, home, and in the community. A wide range of services are offered, including assessments, crisis management, care management, group and individual counseling, and skills training.

Treatment is family-focused, and individualized for each child or adolescent, with an emphasis on maintaining the family unit. From programs for expectant parents to treatment for young adults under 18 years of age, our providers collaborate with community agencies, school counselors, and community resources to ensure access and coordination of care for families living in central and west central Indiana.

Outpatient Counseling Services

Outpatient services are offered to young people under the age of 18. After an initial assessment of the unique emotional and developmental needs of each child, therapists work hand in hand with families to develop a treatment plan. Outpatient services may include individual, group or family therapy, psychiatric evaluation/treatment, psychological testing, and substance abuse treatment.

Home and Community-based Services

Care Managers provide mental health services in children's homes to assist them and their families in reaching their treatment goals. In addition, our care managers work to connect families with other available resources in the community and do everything possible to help families function as a unit.

School-based Services

Hamilton Center staff coordinate services with school corporations to address social and emotional issues that may be affecting a student's performance. Staff are embedded within the school system to provide services that focus on: frustration management, focus/attention, following directions, organization and time management, forming peer relationships, and building resiliency. Please check with your school for a referral to begin services.

Navigation

Navigators work with families to help them secure health insurance coverage. Hamilton Center accepts self-pay consumers and those with private insurance, including Medicaid. Navigators can also help with applying for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) when eligible. When eligibility is not met, Navigators will work to refer children and families to other high-quality providers in the community.
